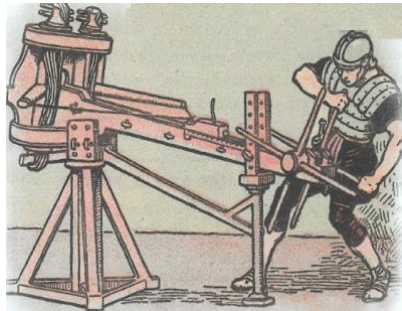

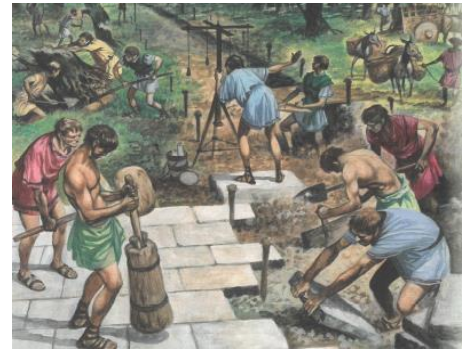

- Today

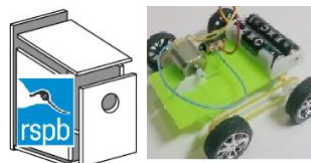
Bede says it wasn't just the Saxons that Vortigern invited to Britain. The Angles and the Jutes, two other tribes from Europe, came too.
